- Application Window opens February 1st, 2021
 - Projects with measures that incurred expenses from November 2, 2020 onwards are eligible to apply retro-actively with submitted not later than March 1, 2021
- Incentives of:
 - Up to \$250,000 are available per project or site
 - Up to \$500,000 per parent company
- Contractors must be registered with the Energy Savings for Business program to participate

Contractor Eligibility

- Any member of the supply chain can be an "Eligible Contractor" provided the company meets the requirements in the Contractor Code of Conduct and accepts the conditions.
 - Installers (Traditional meaning of the word Contractor)
 - Manufacturers
 - Distributors
 - Design, Engineering Firm, Architectural Firms and Other Firms





- Our expectations:
 - complete documentation
 - adherence to the measure list
 - set reasonable expectations
 - promote the program and its benefits

The Code of Conduct is designed to establish minimum performance expectations and business requirements that any reputable Product and Service Provider will already have in place. There will be a need to ensure adherence to the Measures List and provide the required documentation.





General Eligibility Guidelines: Participants and Facilities

All businesses and non-profits serviced by an Alberta electric utility are eligible, except for residences, new construction projects, municipally, federal and provincially owned buildings, publicly funded institutions and Large Emitters.

Eligible organizations include, but are not limited to:

- Individual businesses
- Non-profit organizations
- Co-operatives
- Private schools that are not eligible for government funding
- The common spaces / building envelope of multi-unit residential buildings
- Farms registered as a business







To be an "Eligible Measure," a Measure must meet all the requirements outlined in the Terms and Conditions, including:

- The Measure meets all specifications in the Eligible Measures List.
- The Measure was designed, sold and/or installed by an Eligible Contractor.
- The components of the Measure are not used, refurbished or rebuilt.
- No part of the Measure is associated with routine maintenance.
- The Measure meets applicable Canadian Certification Standards.
- The Participant has obtained all required permits, licenses, approvals and authorizations that may be required (including any development, electrical or building permits) to install the Measure.
